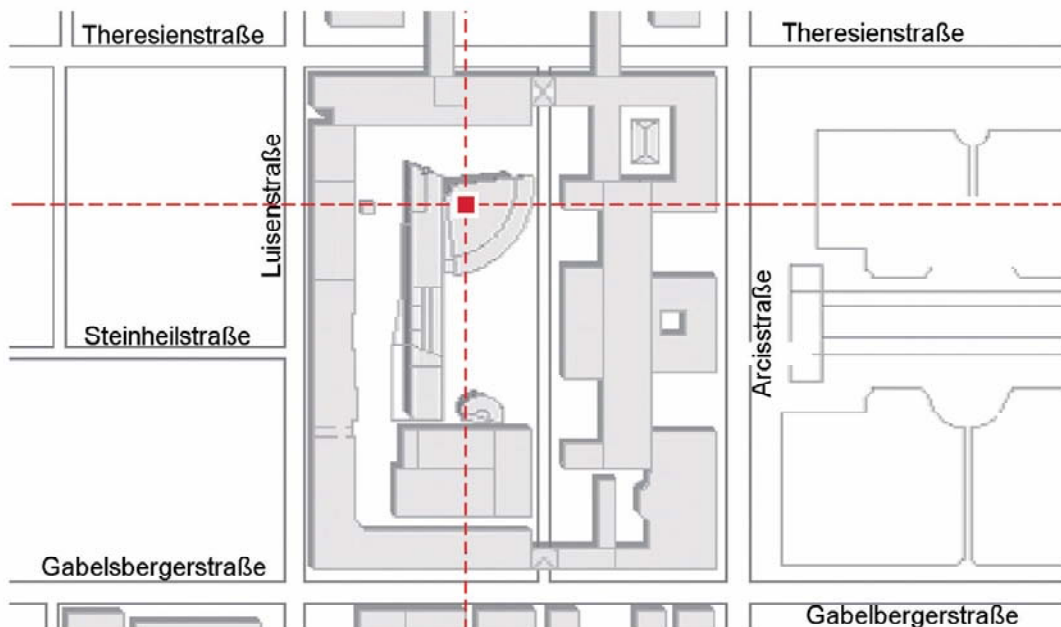
CV of Mohamed A. El-Erian

Mohamed A. El-Erian is president and CEO of Harvard Management Company. He is responsible for the \$ 35.9 bn endowment assets of Harvard University. El-Erian also serves as a member of the faculty of Harvard Business School and as deputy treasurer of the University, providing advice to the president, CFO, and other administrators on the management of Harvard's financial resources.

Prior to joining HMC, El-Erian, was a managing director at Pacific Investment Management Company (PIMCO), the institutional money manager specializing in fixed income management with over \$ 600 bn in assets under management. He is a former managing director of Salomon Smith Barney/Citibank in London, where he oversaw the emerging markets economic research team in London. He spent 15 years, from 1983 to 1997, with the International Monetary Fund (IMF), leading policy work on debt and country issues. He has published widely on international economic topics.

El-Erian has served on several boards and committees, including the Emerging Markets Traders Association (EMTA) and the IMF's Committee of Eminent Persons. He is currently a board member of the International Center for Research on Women and the Peterson Institute for International Economics. He is also a member of the U.S. Treasury Borrowing Advisory Committee and the IMF's Capital Markets Consultative Group, and chairs Microsoft's Investment Advisory Committee.

El-Erian earned a B.A. in economics from Cambridge University and doctoral and master's degrees in economics from Oxford University.
